III. First Public Hearing for FY 2021 – 2022 Budget Presentation – Zennie Lynch A. BIA revenue sources overview:

1. Federal government

Federal funding includes CARES Act funding included: Relief Act (\$103K), American Recovery Act (\$365K), Covid Learning Loss (\$101K) and other designated funds totaling \$734K. In a normal year, the CARES and Covid-related revenue would not be present.

- State Charter School Commission state funding BIA is expecting to be fully enrolled with 540 students in the 2021 – 2022 school year. Funding is \$10,462 / student. This is the largest component of our revenues.
- **3. Donation budget** Budget is based on historical data.
- **4.** School-based fundraisers Annual Boosterthon fundraiser.
- B. 2021 2022 Expenditures
 - 1. **Staffing**. Anticipated FTE count. Increasing staff FTEs from 51.5 to 56.5, which represents BIAs continued investment in instructional staff. BIA is adding 5 new positions including teachers, ESOL, Instructional Support and a school nurse.

A cost-of-living adjustment will be made of 1.5% for all returning staff members.

- 2. Employee benefits. Teachers Retirement System Contribution rate will increase from 19.06% to 19.81%. There will be an increase in retirement and health insurance costs.
- 3. **Professional & Technology Services.** \$99K will go towards speech therapy, psychological services, physical and occupational therapy.

A new item for 2021 is an 8-week summer camp designed to address learning loss for up to 75 students. This will be funded by federal dollars.

- 4. **Purchased property services.** Projects include HVAC repairs and upgrades. Assumption being made that repair and maintenance costs will decrease following the HVAC replacement.
- 5. **Supplies / Furniture**. We originally leased furniture; classroom furniture will be replaced during FY21 and FY22. Covid-19 supplies and software will be paid for with federal funds.
- 6. **Other operating expenses**. Interest payment on bond debt. Property tax for 3031 Shallowford Rd is budgeted.
- 7. **Debt servicing**. The 1st annual principal payment is due on July 1 of \$100,000.
- 8. **Capital spending**. Awning installation over front entry and walkway. Procurement and installation of HVAC system.
